Our Executive Director/CEO Bob Biskupiak has accepted the position of Deputy Insurance Commissioner with the New State Auditor, Commissioner of Securities and Insurance, Matthew M. Rosendale. With short notice our IIAM leadership has made some quick decisions in regard to the folks that will represent you in 2017. Kerri Emmons has been named as your next IIAM Executive Director and the services of old IIAM Executive Director Roger McGlenn has been obtained as your Government Relations/Lobbyist position for the 2017 session.
